C. Convenience Center

<u>Discussion:</u> City of Robert Lee Convenience Center has been closed for about two months, council has noticed increased dumping around the City. Guidelines have been provided by Luke Sheldon in case they reopen.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Jason Moran to close the Convenience Center until the pandemic comes to an end. Seconded by Council Member Grace Todacheeny. Vote 4-0, motion carries

D. EDC Project & EH&T Reese Albert Estimate

<u>Discussion:</u> EDC has asked Luke Sheldon if there are any projects that they can fund. The Sewer Plant could use some upgrades, and he suggest getting the intersection at Austin and 9th street to be repayed by a third party.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Jason Moran to appoint Luke Sheldon to get estimates on the Sewer Plant upgrades and to approve getting estimates on these projects. Seconded by Council Member Grace Todacheeny. Vote 4-0, Motion Carries

E. Municipal Code – Municode

F. Republic Services – Curbside Pickup

<u>Discussion:</u> Since the Convenience Center has been closed, there has been an increased amount of dumping around the City. The city could set up a contract with Republic Services to set up curbside pickup for the citizens. It would cost \$185.00 per hour, plus \$46.38 per ton.
